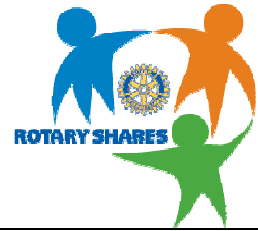

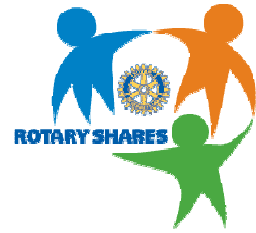

Let's make sure we are in the centre of the action by booking early!

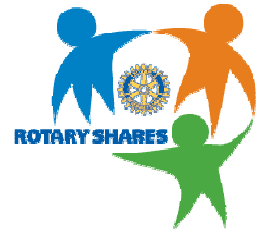
"A young woman really thought she'd been very patient through a protracted period of dating with no talk of marriage.

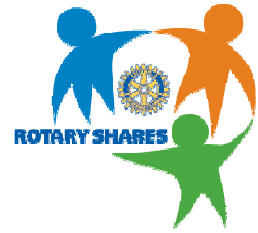
